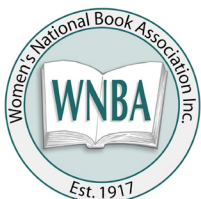
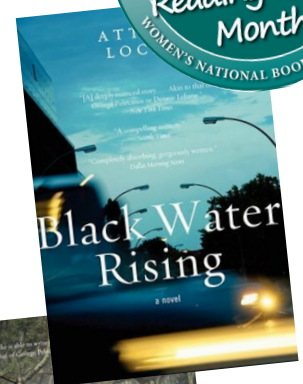
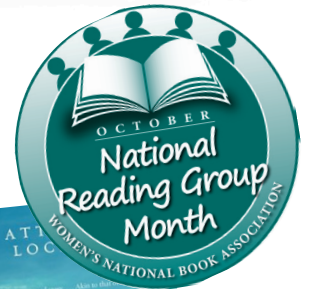

Attica Locke's first novel, *Black Water Rising*, was shortlisted for the Orange Prize and nominated for an Edgar Award, an NAACP Image Award, a *Los Angeles Times* Book Prize, and a *Strand Magazine* Critics Award. It was also a finalist for the Hurston-Wright Legacy Award. Locke's second novel, *The Cutting Season*, the story of a murder on a Louisiana plantation, will be released in September 2012. Locke has worked as a screenwriter and lives in Los Angeles.
